

KANUGA CONFERENCE CENTER is an Episcopal Conference Center near Hendersonville, NC. Well-known throughout the southeast for its setting in the Smoky Mountains, its well-appointed lodge, comfortable guest cottages, and schedule of spiritual conferences, Kanuga has become a household name as the place where the Bishops gather to share their lives and their faith as they make tough decisions.

Kanuga can be reached by air by flying to Asheville, NC and traveling by commercial van or taxi (reservation information will be mailed to you from Kanuga) to the conference center. By Interstate, head toward Asheville, which is the home of the famed Biltmore Estate, the Grove Park Inn and numerous gift and art galleries. More shopping and golf are also nearby.

Participants may wish to request a room at the lodge, which offers motel-style facilities, or in the guest cottages, which house 2 to 12 persons with a family-style living room and screened porch. Meals are taken in the glass-walled dining room, and the sound of the bugle finds men and women scurrying toward the good food with appetites stimulated by the mountain air.

A beautiful wooded chapel and lakeside chapel offer ideal spots for formal daily worship during the conference, while the trails, informal meditation spots, and labyrinth are favorites for reflection and relaxation during free time. There are also tennis courts and a 30-acre lake for swimming, boating, and fishing. A bookstore carries titles relating to the conference, as well as many other spiritual and educational books, and a canteen is available as well. The coffee and tea pots are available throughout the day in the foyer of the dining room, and the rocking chair porch calls out for cozy conversations. Cabaret—an evening fellowship time—enjoys the Fireplace Lounge and the Pavilion by the lake.

Once discovered—Kanuga will become a never-to-be-forgotten part of YOUR life.

Solo Flight Conference

SOLO FLIGHT is an intergenerational conference for single adults which was founded to offer opportunities for those who are single in the Episcopal Church—and their single friends from other traditions—opportunities for spiritual growth, learning, fellowship and networking with those who share similar values.

Homebase for SOLO FLIGHT is Kanuga, an Episcopal conference center in the Great Smoky Mountains. The conference is staffed by professionals who know the single experience first hand and are themselves on a spiritual journey. SOLO FLIGHT also joint ventures in other areas of the country.

While comfort in living is normally enhanced by structures, traditions and rituals which support and sustain, single adults live in a world that is basically without institutional support, guidelines, rituals or traditions. SOLO FLIGHT CONFERENCE offers a form of institutional support, guidelines, and guided participation in making maps in the world of singleness, rituals and traditions for the journey, all based in the Eucharist celebration, and the belief that the only relationship that will not fail is the relationship through Jesus Christ.

The 2006 Theme:

“Solo Flight and the Spirituality of Homing”

In a couple-oriented church and society, single adults often struggle with what home is to them, as well as how to create and enjoy home as a single person, whether they are creating their first independent home, or re-creating a home after the loss of spouse or partner through death or the breaking of relationship. Creating a home for one: why it can be hard, and how it can be a blessing, is a major developmental task for single adults. Thomas Breidenthal, author of *Christian Households: the sanctification of nearness* and other presenters will assist the 2006 Solo Flight community in looking at the challenges and joys of the Christian approach to householding. The conference will focus on broadening understanding of what home and householding mean to us as people of faith, how the creation of our homes is connected to our understanding of who we are as single men and women who were created to be relational people, and as Dr. Breidenthal says, “how we balance loyalty and care for those who are closest to us with commitment to the universal and inclusive fellowship that is prefigured in the church.”
